A man was once asked why there are so many different churches. He said, “Well, when I moved to town there were two churches: the one I went to and the one I didn’t. After a disagreement, there were three: the one I used to go to, the one I go to now, and the one I’ll never go to again.”

It’s a joke, of course—but like many jokes, it contains a little truth. Christians have organized themselves into many different denominations over the centuries. Sometimes that happened because of disagreements. But more often, denominations help churches organize their ministry, share resources, and work together to spread the good news of Jesus.

Denominations are one way the church lives out its shared calling. For us, that means being part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Within the ELCA, congregations are organized into regional bodies called synods.

The word synod comes from the Greek words syn (together) and hodos (way or road). Literally, it means “walking the way together.” Early Christians often described themselves as followers of “the Way” (Acts 9:2), the path of life shaped by Jesus. A synod, then, is simply churches walking that path of faith together.

Fish Lake is part of the St. Paul Area Synod, which connects us with other congregations across the east metro. In practical terms, synods help congregations support one another. They raise up and guide leaders, encourage congregations in their mission and coordinate shared ministries. Rather than each congregation working alone, synods help us remember that we are part of something bigger than ourselves.

On May 15 and 16, voting members from a106 congregations will elect the next bishop to lead our synod. Please keep this process in your prayers—for the candidates, for the voting members, and for the whole church as we listen for the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

More information about the bishop candidates can be found on the St. Paul Area Synod website. Our voting members are Rick Cedergren, Marshall Saunders, Candy McColley, and Pastor Teleen.

Old Business:

- a. Grad Quilts: Three quilts for 2026 grads have been completed; working on one more. They will be presented to the 2026 graduates on June 7th. Will check on any completed quilts for 2027 graduates.
- b. Baptism Quilts: Three baptisms are scheduled for the next couple months. We have several quilts on hand.

Donations to/from WELCA:

- Reading Buddies/Comfort Buddies: Several were given for delivery to the EMS.
- Safe Haven Foster Shoppe/Bundles of Love: Seventeen items were donated in March.
- Northwoods Animal Shelter/Anoka County Humane Society: Cathy Twingstrom will be delivering to the Animal Shelter 7 beds and 27 blankets
- Food Shelf: April is canned vegetables. Fifty-four lbs. of food were delivered to the food shelf.
- Schools: Personal care items are delivered alternating between Trinity and Cambridge. Hope is the contact.
- A Place For You Homeless Shelter, Pine City: No report.
- Little Libraries: Books are delivered to Trinity on an ongoing basis.
- Ruff Start Rescue: Six bags of medicine bottles were taken to the facility by 2 BOM members.

Meadow Creek Women's Shelter: There is a great need for women's clothing. POC is Patti Ricke. She took at least 4 boxes/bags of clothing to the shelter along with 2 boxes of personal care items from Bath and Body. She has requested that we keep the clothing collection to Spring/Summer items only, currently due to space restraints at the facility.

New Business:

Advertising: Upcoming Memorial Day Dinner. The chicken dinner will remain as last year with the possibility of adding baked beans to the menu. Advertising in Cambridge requires 4 weeks' notification. Have received the request form. Discussed the flyer advertising the dinner. We decided on the flyer which will be printed and ready to distribute at next month's meeting. The cost for the dinner will remain the same as last year. Also, I will request funds from Thrivent.

FISH LAKE SCHOLARSHIP

Purpose: To provide financial support for students who are members of Fish Lake Lutheran Church.

Policy: Students shall receive an annual financial gift upon meeting membership requirements and completing the scholarship application. Scholarship awards will be made based upon application requirements being met and the balance in the scholarship fund.

Student Requirements:

1. Students must be an active member of Fish Lake Lutheran Church for at least two (2) years.
2. Students must complete the Fish Lake Scholarship application by May 15.
3. Each scholarship recipient must continue to participate in service as follows:
 - a. Technical and undergraduate college: a minimum of 10 hours annually
 - b. Graduate school: a minimum of 10 hours annually, 5 of which are in a leadership role
 - c. Seminary: Ministry services at minimum of 20 hours per semester in a leadership role.

Scholarship Awards: (Depending on funds available)

Technical and undergraduate college up to \$300 annually for four years with a GPA of 2.0 or higher*

Graduate school student up to \$500 annually for two years with a GPA of 3.0 or higher*

Seminary students up to \$1500 annually (\$750/semester) for four years with a GPA of 3.5 or higher*

*Part-time students in any category receive half of the scholarship aid offered.

Consent Calendar

Items on the consent calendar were presented for approval. The following motion was made by Pete Meagher, seconded, and unanimously approved: CC 26.04.01 Moved: That the Council approve the agenda and previous minutes as presented.

Devotion/Opening Prayer

Rick led us through John 20:19–22, focusing on when the disciples, overwhelmed, exhausted, gathered behind locked doors and were met by Jesus. He stood among them and breathed on them filling them with the Holy Spirit. This passage reminds us that, like the disciples, we are not meant to rely on our own limited energy. Jesus first fills us with peace and renewal, then connects us to His larger mission. The everyday work of the church, is part of creating a space where faith can grow and the Spirit can dwell. We are not just completing tasks; we are sustaining a living, breathing community of faith. Ending with a thank you to all for helping make the Easter Services successful.

Pastor's Report-Pastor Teleen

The pastor shared reflections on a meaningful Easter season, with gratitude extended to those who helped decorate the sanctuary and outdoor spaces, creating a welcoming environment for worship. Bible study participation remained strong, with 16–20 attendees, and the Team Tim mixed-age group approach proved to be a success. Despite challenging March weather, the congregation adapted and persevered. The office is currently exploring new software for bulletins and newsletters ahead of the current system becoming obsolete in October, so some changes may be noticeable. Special thanks were given to the music staff for their talent and flexibility, and there is excitement as many upcoming baptisms are planned.

Financial Reports

The council received the financial report, noting our copier and paper expenses were slightly more than expected.

Committee Reports

*Communications–Working on website updates, will plan on new photos and videos this summer.

*Property and Safety–Exploring new shrubs, and landscape rock. Funding for the basement door is in place, connecting with the contractor for installation, date TBD.

*Social Ministry–Nothing to report.

*Worship and Music–We exploring a grant to install signage, and support our female youth choir “Sjona” (possible overnight trip to sing in a nursing home and churches without a choir). Thank you to the Alter Guild for making the church look great.

*Youth and Family–Discussion around paying the balance of fees for our youth to attend camp this summer. Nancy Hoffman made a motion CC 26.04.02 to use \$3,790.00 from the Youth Fund to cover these expenses, the motion passed with Rick Cedergren abstaining from the vote.

*Evangelism and Stewardship–Nothing to report

*WELCA–Nothing reported.

New Business

Kitchen floor- flooring is worn and needing to be replaced, reaching out to get updated bids for replacement.

·Primary Organist- Kirstie Felland has expressed interest in our open organists role. A motion was made by Jen Kroschel, to offer the primary organist position Kristie, the motion was seconded, and unanimously approved. CC. 26.04.03 moved: Pastor Teleen is authorized to offer the primary organist role to Kristie Felland.

·Organ Maintenance and Assessment- discussed having the organ professionally evaluated, agreed to request professional assessment.

·Shalom Funds donation discussed. A motion was made by Rick to donate funds to our local food banks, the motion was seconded.Moved: Fish Lake will donate \$2000.00 to each of our local food banks (Cambridge, Rush City, and North Branch) totaling \$6,000.00.

·Basement Exterior Door. A donation was made for the door replacement, council unanimously agreed to proceed with the replacement over email.

A MESSAGE FROM SISTER LADONNA....

As I have been recovering from my recent ankle surgery (foot elevated with an ice pack over it), I have had a chance to do more journaling. One of the things that has helped me during this Lent has been reading some of the Psalms.

Jesus quoted the Psalms many times – even when he was on the cross. Of course, Jesus would have been well educated in the Psalms. He would have prayed with the Psalms throughout his life.

The Psalms are often called the prayer book of the Bible. Most of the Psalms are attributed to King David or associates of his. Through these writings, we are given a full range of experiences and emotions. When we pray with the Psalms we share with God our own experiences and emotions so that in God’s presence we can discover healing.

I find that the best way for me to access the Psalms is to choose a few verses at a time and then rewrite those verses into my own experience. So that, ‘The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not be in want’ becomes ‘I am one of Christ’s sheep. If I have Christ, I have everything that I need’ That rewriting then opens me to be able to pray, ‘God, I thank you for all that you have given me and all that you continue to give’.

Or, I might use Psalm 38:6. ‘I am utterly bowed down and prostrate: all day long I go around mourning.’ Depending on the circumstances I might rewrite this to say, ‘I am depressed and lonely. Where are you God?’

I encourage you to open the Psalms and engage with the verses in a way that draws you closer to God. God certainly hears our prayers and understands all of our emotions. Opening to the Psalms might be a great way for you to connect with God!

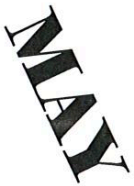
